Toy Guidelines

Toy makers are reminded that holes for axles 7/32" or machinist #2. Quarter inch holes are too big. Minimum body width is 1 1/8". Narrower bodies require the axles be shortened.

SC designated two types of toys made for Christmas. Mass produced type is given to approved charities and agencies for distribution to disadvantaged children. These include wheeled vehicles and building blocks turned out in large quantities and strollers and cradles. More elaborate and detailed toys are given to a select group of charities and agencies to auction off for their fundraisers. These are also strollers and cradles given to the Whittier Boys and Girls Club. Other charities and agencies may be added with **SC** action. An effort to increase the number of toys more suitable and desirable to girls will be made. **All members** are encouraged to add to the club's inventory.

All members are reminded that donated wood, used by members may not be used for projects for sale.
