A lengthy discussion on where to store the estimated 8 pick up loads of wood followed. **Joe Carrillo** said that that 2 x 4s, 2 x 6s etc. could be stored at Hathaway Ranch for blocks but odd sizes could not be stored there without prior arrangements made with Hathaway ranch.

Hunter Smith volunteered to store the wood in his driveway for a week.

The consensus was a need to determine if the wood being donated could be used by the club prior to acceptance and may be declined.

Ron Anderson discussed the elephant puzzles he was making for this years toy production.

Barbara Lockwood asked if there were written job descriptions for the offices of the club. There are none.

The Wood is handrail in various woods profiles and sizes, Red Oak 4" x 1/2" x random lengths, some 2" x 4" and 6" etc. The 2" x stock is reserved for block production. More wood to come. Stay tuned.

The wood is available to **all wood members** and **Hathaway Ranch** to use in any manner except firewood.
